## Challenges Ahead by Bill Bohlman, Temple President

As we celebrate the temple's 79th anniversary we are faced with a new set of challenges. For the first time since its founding, the temple does not have a resident minister. What will this mean for BTC?

Although Rev. Patti has retired, she has offered to officiate memorial services when requested and she is available to do so. This generous offer allows us to assure our members that the temple will be able to provide for their needs in such cases. With regard to the regular Sunday services, a plan is also being developed.

Rev. Patti has been working with Bishop Noriaki Ito and others at the North American District Higashi Honganji {NAD} on a plan to assure a ministerial presence during our search for the next resident minister. Under this plan, a remote minister would provide the guidance needed with regard to religious matters, do a live dharma talk at least once a month and write an article for the Bulletin. This minister, although not in the Chicago area, would also be available for consultation. NAD has also made available other ministers for live dharma talks and has made their prerecorded dharma talks available to us. The actual running of the Sunday service will be handled by the lay leaders that Rev. Patti has trained over the past few years.

For the day to day administrative duties, we have hired an office manager who will work part time four days a week. However, we will need volunteers to help one day a week and at times with other tasks that need to be performed. BTC has a long history of the sangha stepping up to help; now more than ever we need that help. It is important that BTC maintain its religious and cultural traditions. It is up to the sangha to maintain these traditions.

Seventy-nine years ago, Rev. Gyomay Kubose and a group of dedicated individuals founded what was then known as the Chicago Buddhist Church. It is because of their hard work and perseverance that we are able to enjoy the wonderful temple we now have. The torch is passed; it is up to us to assure that BTC will continue to be a place where anyone is welcome to hear the dharma. Together we will make this happen. Namu Amida Butsu.
