## Ministerial Update Bill Bohlman, Temple President

It has been a little over one year since Rev. Patti retired. During this time, the ministerial duties have been filled by Rev. Fred Brenion, who offered to act as supervisory minister until we get a new resident minister. Rev. Fred has officiated Sunday services and has provided thoughtful and engaging Dharma talks. Recently, Rev. Fred and his wife, Antoinette, visited for a weekend. On Saturday, Rev. Fred gave a seminar that dealt with his path to the Dharma and his becoming a minister. Attended by thirty people, the seminar was enlightening and relatable.

With regard to our next resident minister, Victor Ogundipe, Jr. is currently training for his Kyoshi ordination. Victor recently went to Japan where he received his Tokudo ordination at Higashi Honganji. Victor is currently living in Berkeley, California with his wife and daughter while he attends the Institute of Buddhist Studies (IBS). While he is in Berkeley, he is also assisting at the Berkeley Higashi temple. The current timetable is for Victor to receive Kyoshi ordination within the next year. Sometime in mid 2026, Victor will finish his studies at IBS and will be qualified to be resident minister.

In preparation for Victor's possibly becoming our next resident minister, he will give Dharma talks and visit during the interim period. Currently the plan is for him to speak sometime in January and visit us along with his family in May 2025. Through these talks and visits we will get to know Victor and he will get to know our sangha. The hope is that all parties will find a compatibility and mutual desire to learn and live the Dharma.

We recently celebrated the temple's 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary. During that time, we have had outstanding ministers who have skillfully shared the Dharma with us. Together with whoever is our next resident minister BTC will continue to be a place for all to share the wisdom of the teachings.
